KIDS ENJOY CHRISTMAS AT THE SHELTER




On December 21, 2024, the young residents of the shelter enjoyed a magical Christmas. After a delicious meal and

STUDENTS FROM ABOBO SCHOOL GROUP VISIT THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

THE PORTUGUESE EMBASSY EQUIPS A SCHOOL CAFETERIA AT KOUASSI-PERITA



On January 17, 2025, the Kouassi Perita public elementary school near Bouaflé celebrated the opening of its new school cafeteria, thanks to a donation of 15 million CFA francs from the Portuguese Embassy in Côte d'Ivoire in partnership with the Children of Africa Foundation. The donations included food and non-food items (rice, oil, cleaning products, etc.) to support the nutrition and education of the students.

The ceremony, marked with joy and gratitude, brought together local authorities, parents, teachers, and students, as well as representatives from the two donor partners. The Portuguese Ambassador, Maria Da Conceicao de Sousa Pilar, and Ms. Cissé Aissatou from the Foundation emphasized the importance of this initiative in combating malnutrition, promoting school attendance, and offering children equal opportunities for success.

INAUGURATION OF THE SCHOOL OF EXCELLENCE AND MOTHERS' DAY CELEBRATION



On May 31, 2025, Mrs. Dominique Ouattara, President of the Children Of Africa Foundation, inaugurated the a boarding school for girls in Sinematiali. Located in northern Côte d'Ivoire, this prestigious facility bears her illustrious name.

The event was marked by a ribbon-cutting ceremony followed by a tour of the school, which was built to international standards and includes all the necessary amenities. The completion of this architectural gem marks a crucial step in promoting girls' education, especially in this area, which was once plagued by socio-cultural constraints. Built on an area of approximately 7 hectares, the high school is equipped with modern facilities including specialized classrooms, a library, an amphitheater, dormitories (600 beds, 8 of which are specially equipped for people with reduced mobility), a dining hall, sports fields, and housing for teachers.

53 TEENAGERS FROM THE MINORS' REHABILITATION CENTER RECEIVE THEIR TRAINING CERTIFICATES



On September 26, 2025, the Bouaké Juvenile Rehabilitation Center held a certificate award ceremony for 53 teenagers who had completed six months of training in various trades, including sewing, hairdressing, leatherwork, animal husbandry, agriculture, IT, and traditional cloth weaving. The ceremony, which featured cultural performances and an exhibition of the beneficiaries' work, witnessed the presence of several dignitaries, including representatives of the Children Of Africa Foundation, the Judicial Protection of Children, and the Bouaké City Hall. After this training, the young people will rejoin their families and continue their training for three years with artisans, with regular monitoring. They will also leave with kits of materials to help them integrate into the workforce and society.



9th EDITION OF THE EDUCATIONAL TRIP TO CAP-D'AIL: DOMINIQUE OUATTARA OFFERS AN EDUCATIONAL TRIP TO FRANCE FOR THE 12 BEST STUDENTS OF COTE D'IVOIRE DEPARTURE CEREMONY



The ninth edition of the ceremony sending off the best students in Côte d'Ivoire to the educational camp in Cap d'Ail, France, took place on July 18, 2025, at the headquarters of the Children Of Africa Foundation in Cocody.

For this 9th edition, eleven students, including five girls and six boys, among the best in the country, benefited from an educational stay in Cap d'Ail, in the south of France. The winners' average grades range from 17.55 to 18.58 out of 20. For three weeks, these young people will have the

opportunity to interact with children from diverse cultural backgrounds, discover different cultures and, above all, enrich their knowledge and aspirations.

Organized annually, this trip is a real cultural, social, and personal springboard for the selected students. Since 2015, this collaboration has enabled students from various Ivorian schools recognized for their excellent academic results to enjoy an enriching stay at the Mediterranean Center for French Studies on the French Riviera.

THE BEST IVORIAN STUDENTS RETURN TO ABIDJAN AFTER A STAY IN CAP D'AIL



After three weeks of learning and discovery in Cap d'Ail, in the south of France, the eleven best students from Côte d'Ivoire returned to Abidjan on August 9, 2025. They were accompanied by Dr. Alain Nys, President of the Association Cite Club Universitaire, a partner in the program, and his wife. Upon their arrival at the Felix Houphouet Boigny International Airport, they were welcomed by Ms. Beatrice Durand, Head of Social Affairs at the Children Of Africa Foundation. This trip, offered by the Children Of Africa Foundation, was part of the 9th edition of the Cap d'Ail educational camp. The official departure of the winners was organized on July 18 at the Foundation's headquarters in Abidjan-Cocody.

THE CHILDREN OF AFRICA FOUNDATION DONATES 15,000 SCHOOL KITS TO SCHOOLCHILDREN IN COTE D'IVOIRE



First Lady Dominique Ouattara, President of the Children Of Africa Foundation, officially launched the national campaign to distribute 15,000 school kits to schoolchildren in Côte d'Ivoire on October 9, 2025, in Daloa. The ceremony, held at the Daloa Sud B School Group, brought together many authorities and the people who came to welcome this initiative in support of education. Of these kits, 5,000 were donated to schools in Daloa to support families and improve learning conditions.

In addition to the school kits, the First Lady made donations to teachers, canteens and nursery schools and provided financial assistance of more than 4 million CFA francs to schoolchildren and local residents.

In her speech, Mrs. Ouattara reaffirmed that education remains a priority for her foundation and urged parents to send all their children, both girls and boys, to school. She also encouraged teachers and students to continue their efforts to achieve academic success. This ceremony marks the start of a new educational solidarity campaign in line with the mission of the Children Of Africa Foundation: to give every child the means to build their future through education.

This future specialized facility will allow for open-heart surgery, addressing the urgent needs of many children suffering from heart conditions. Accompanied by Nadine Sngaré, Director of the Children of Africa Foundation, Hachim Diop, Director General of the HME in Bingerville, and the entire management team, as well as Hussein Bourgi, Director of UNISERV, First Lady Dominique Ouattara toured the various departments under construction.

RAMADAN 2025: MRS. DOMINIQUE OUATTARA GIVES HER SUPPORT TO MUSLIM COMMUNITY



On March 13, 2025, at the headquarters of the Children of Africa Foundation, Mrs. Dominique Ouattara gave her support to the Muslim community during the holy month of Ramadan.

The ceremony witnessed the presence of several prominent figures, including religious leaders and Muslim worshippers. On this occasion, Mrs. Ouattara, President of the Children of Africa Foundation, presented donations of food and non-food items worth 130 million CFA francs to the Muslim community. These donations to be given to associations, NGOs, and mosques throughout the country, consisted of 3,000 bags of rice of 25kg, 2,000 bags of sugar of 25kg, 2,000 cartons of oil, 4,000 bags of pasta, 600 cartons of tomato paste, 600 cartons of milk, and 800 prayer mats.

CHRISTIAN LENT SEASON: MRS. DOMINIQUE OUATTARA MAKES DONATIONS WORTH 130 MILLION FCFA TO THE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY



On April 8, 2025, Mrs. Dominique Ouattara made a significant donation of food supplies worth 130 million CFA francs to the Christian community for Easter 2025. Comprising essential food items, these donations were primarily intended for the country's most vulnerable families. They were distributed to Catholic parishes, Methodist and Evangelical churches, the African Revealed Churches, as well as numerous religious congregations and associations throughout the country.



KICK OFF OF THE 16TH EDITION OF THE DOMINIQUE OUATTARA CUP IN 75 CITIES ACROSS THE COUNTRY



The 16th edition of the Dominique Ouattara Cup football tournament was officially launched on July 2, 2025, in Cocody by Mrs. Dominique Ouattara, President of the Children of Africa Foundation. The event brought together members of the government, sports figures, including Samuel Eto'o, Didier Zokora, Gervinho, and many children.

Organized in 75 locations across the country, this tournament is for children aged 7 to 15 and aims to promote sport, education, social cohesion, and the personal development of young people. The total investment is over 125 million CFA francs, with 30.75 million CFA francs allocated to bonus.

Each locality will receive 410,000 CFA francs in financial support, distributed among the finalist teams, the top scorer, and the best goalkeeper. The tournament thus provides a platform for the development and recognition of young talent.



CHILDREN OF AFRICA FOUNDATION'S CHRISTMAS TREE 2024



On December 19, 2024, the Presidential Palace, located in Plateau, hosted the 2024 edition of the traditional Christmas Tree celebration organized by the Children of Africa Foundation.

MRS. DOMINIQUE OUATTARA INAUGURATES THE «SAFE HOME», A CENTER FOR ABUSED WOMEN IN ADIAKE



On April 10, 2025, Mrs. Dominique Ouattara, President of the Children of Africa Foundation, inaugurated the «Safe Home» Women's Shelter in Adiaké, a center for women victims of gender-based violence (GBV).

This center, one of the largest in Africa, has 100 beds for women, 12 beds for children, as well as extensive medical, legal, educational, and recreational facilities. It was funded by donations raised at the 8th annual Children of Africa Foundation Gala Dinner.

The «Safe Home» Women's Center offers a secure refuge for women victims of gender-based violence, along with medical and legal support. It features a training center, cultural and sports facilities, and much more. Built on a 2-hectare site, it is one of the largest and most modern in the sub-region.





WOMEN'S PROTECTION: DR. DENIS MUKWGE IMPRESSED BY ADIAKE'S «SAFE HOME» WOMEN'S SHELTER



On May 23, 2025, Dr. Denis Mukwege, Congolese gynecologist and Nobel Peace Prize laureate, visited the «Safe Home» women's center in Adiaké, on the sidelines of the Félix Houphouët-Boigny Peace Prize ceremony in Abidjan.

The distinguished visitor was accompanied by Ms. Nadine Sangaré, Director of the Children of Africa Foundation, and other prominent figures committed to combating gender-based violence (GBV).

Dr. Mukwege attended a working session on the center's operations before giving a guided tour. This visit underscores Côte d'Ivoire's leading role in protecting women's rights and its humanitarian commitment.

MOTHER'S DAY: DOMINIQUE OUATTARA BRINGS GIFTS TO THE WOMEN OF SINEMATIALI



On May 31, 2025, Mrs. Dominique Ouattara, President of the Children of Africa Foundation, celebrated mothers in Sinématiali, on the sidelines of the inauguration ceremony for the girls' high school in that town. During the event, Mrs. Ouattara announced an additional allocation of 500 million CFA francs to the FAFCI (Fund for the Support of Women's Development in Côte d'Ivoire) for the Poro region, bringing the regional budget to 3 billion CFA francs. She also donated in-kind contributions (food, equipment, vehicles, and traditional fabrics) worth 500 million CFA francs and distributed 13 million CFA francs in cash, for a total of 513 million CFA francs given to the local population.



The Samu Social in Mali



In a challenging context, Samu Social Mali continues its work in 2025 supporting children and young people living on the streets and in camps for internally displaced persons (IDPs) in Bamako. Through mobile aid teams, Samu Social provides daily emergency services (medical care, psychosocial support, shelter, food assistance, etc.) to 988 children during the first half of the year.

The HAC Center in Cameroon



The center organized recreational activities during the summer holidays with the instructors.

The center was repainted and underwent general maintenance, including classrooms decoration for the start of the new school year in October 2025. New teaching materials were also purchased.

The Samu Social in Burkina Faso



In 2025, the Social Emergency Medical Service (Samu Social) in Burkina Faso conducted hundreds of outreach patrols, medical consultations, personalized assistance programs, and listening sessions to combat the social exclusion of children and young people living on the streets and vulnerable in the impoverished neighborhoods of Ouagadougou.

The SOS FEVVF Center in Niger



This year, SOS FEVVF focused on activities contributing to the reintegration of disadvantaged children into the school system. To this end, SOS FEVVF distributed school kits to children from underprivileged backgrounds or children of survivors of gender-based violence, with the aim, among others, of facilitating their return to school.

Solid'Af in Togo



In Kpalimé, Togo, Solid'Af co-financed and built a sports field. Located next to a primary and secondary school, it can be used by nearly 1,000 children and teenagers.

The Sainte Veronique home in Guinea

The home accommodates 30 young women and 10 workers. The center provides schooling, covers building expenses, provides healthcare, and pays the staff salaries.

The Children's Home in Bouake



In 2025, the Children's Home and the Girls' Training Center continued their work to protect and empower children and young people. Thirty-five children were regularly accommodated in the residential program, and 25 in the day program. The beneficiaries received food, psychological, and medical care, as well as academic, extracurricular, social, and family support. At the Girls' Training Center, 45 young women were accommodated.

Sainte Marie Dispensary of Bondoukou



This facility serves vulnerable populations in Gontougo, prioritizing pediatric services: curative care for those in need, purchase of infant nutrition products, pediatric equipment, and nutritional supplements.

Arc en Ciel Children's Home in Odienne

In 2025, the center carried out the following actions:

- Medical care for all residents
- Provision of food supplies
- Upgrading of cleaning equipment for the premises
- Monitoring of children reintegrated into their families of origin



Our Lady of the Springs of Bouake



The Our Lady of the Springs Association provides a home for over 60 orphans and abandoned children aged 0 to 20. The center includes a school with a canteen, covering all three years of preschool and all six years of primary school, ensuring a quality education for both the children housed there and those in the economically disadvantaged neighborhood. The association is committed to offering not only immediate assistance but also genuine opportunities for personal development.

SAPE CI in Abobo



The NGO SAPE CI is a community-based association with a direct, local presence. It comprises a management team of 15 people and approximately 30 volunteers, all social work professionals with degrees from the country's only social training institute. Its focus is on children facing social difficulties and victims of all types of abuse, and it has specialized in providing care for these children for nearly 20 years. All activities are structured around three strategic pillars: Protection, Education, and Health.
